


	UK	India
Facts	The United Kingdom is made up of England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. It is an island nation in north-western Europe. It is surrounded by the English Channel to the south, the North Atlantic Ocean and the Irish Sea to the west and the North Sea to the east and north. Apart from mainland UK and Northern Ireland, the UK has upwards of 1000 smaller islands such as Shetland, Orkney, Fair Isle, the Outer and Inner Hebrides, the Channel Islands, Rockall and the Isle of Wight.	Located in southeast Asia, India is bordered by the Arabian Sea to the south-west and the Bay of Bengal to the south-east. The southern tip of India is bordered by the Indian Ocean.
Size	The UK's coast is 12,429km long.	India's coast is 7517km long.

Temperature	Many types of weather can be experienced in the UK in a single day. The climate of the UK is generally cool, often cloudy and rainy. Temperatures in the north of Scotland and the south of England can differ by 10 to 15°C. January and February are generally the coldest months in the UK, with temperatures anywhere between below 0°C and 10°C. In June, July and August temperatures can be in the range of 20 and 30°C.	January and February are generally the coldest months in India, with temperatures anywhere between 8 and 20°C. In April, May and June temperatures are in the 30s and even 40s.
